What is Inclusion and Why is it Important

Creating and nurturing an inclusive culture is not just for the benefit of specific groups of pupils but for all our pupils, so they can interact with a diverse range of people, leaving them far better equipped to empathise with the needs and backgrounds of others. This is true now but will be particularly so as they go on to embrace the challenges and opportunities of the outside world.

Extensive efforts are made in school to ensure we are as inclusive a community as possible. However, we are very conscious that this is of little value without our pupils feeling a strong sense of belonging.
